- 12 For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.
- 13 Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.



Christian: "Hi, guys. How are you doing?"

Tim Burr: "We're fine"

Christian: What are you doing here?"

Treesa Green: "Looking at trees. We love them"

Tim Burr: "We're here representing the eastside branch of

TWIG"

Christian: "What's TWIG?"

Treesa Green: Trees Wherever I Go. It's an organization that's grown a lot lately. We promise to take care of trees, wherever we go.

Christian: "That's commendable."

Tim Burr: Thanks. We're putting down roots in this area.

Christian: "I agree, we should take care of trees, and we should be careful to use them for the purpose for which they're intended."

Treesa Green: "Right."

Christian: "Do you know what God made them for? Tim Burr: "We wouldn't actually say that God made trees. They evolved... over millions of years."

Christian: "Well, it seems kind of nice that we can use them to provide wood for warmth, housing, and furniture; make maple syrup for pancakes, rubber for tires, and a stack of other useful things; as well as turn the pulp into paper for books. We have trees that feed us with apples, peaches, bananas, apricots, etc. It's also a blessing that trees turn our carbon dioxide back into life-giving oxygen. We couldn't live without them."

Treesa Green: "Whatever. But that's our point. If we keep cutting down trees, there won't be any to give the air its oxygen. Trees are the lungs of the earth! It's an environmental crisis. We will all die. We have to prevent logging companies from cutting down the rain forests, or any trees for that matter!"

Christian: "So you want to protect trees. That's nice. Speaking of dying, I have a question for you. Do you know what is the number one killer of drivers in the U.S.?"

Tim Burr: "Drunk driving?"

Christian: "No. Trees."


Treesa Green: "Are you kidding?"

Christian: "No, I'm not actually. Lining the highways of America are millions of trees. When a car goes off a road and hits a tree, the tree doesn't move, the driver does-into eternity. In the late 1990s the state of Georgia spent \$600 million to cut down all trees within 32 feet of the major highways to make them safer. A spokesman said 27 percent of all deaths each year in

Georgia are from vehicles hitting trees on the side of the road. Can I ask you guys an important question?"

Tim Burr & Treesa Green: "Sure."

Christian: "What do you think happens when you die? Do you think that you will go to heaven?" (etc.)





1. At-Home-Preparation: Practice "Shower Power" – As you shower each day, practice bringing up the subject of God. Don't worry about people hearing you; your family has probably heard you talking or singing in the shower anyway. Here are a few suggestions to help get you started: 1. What do you think about all these hurricanes, earthquakes and tsunamis? We never know when tragedy may strike. Have you thought about what would happen to you if you died? 2. What do you think of all these wars? Makes you think how precious life is? What do you think happens when a person dies? 3. Have you noticed how much we hear in the news about religion –religious movies, series, etc. Do you have a religious background?

Please don't give out all of the tracks I sent you, please keep some for the remainder for the session



2. Real-World Application: Okay, get ready for sweaty palms. If you feel confident, as you continue to leave or give out tracts this week, warmly greet strangers then hand them your favourite Ice Breaker tract. Simply give it to the person the same way you did in class. You can do this! For example, when you're at the checkout stand, greet the cashier and give him a tract as you're leaving. Or as you're going through a fast-food drive-through, engage the person in a conversation about his job or his day. You want him to warm to you. Pass him a tract, say, "Please read this when you've got a minute" and then drop the pedal to the metal and drive away saying to yourself, 1 did it! Thank you, Lord." Better to do it and run than to not do it at all. This may sound scary but think of that person's eternal welfare. Then consider your worst-case scenario. You may hear, "No, thanks." If that happens, deal with it. It won't be pleasant to be rejected, but it isn't the end of the world. But more than likely, the person will take the tract and even thank you for it. Again, remember to smile and offer a warm greeting like, "Good morning. How are you doing?" Just the person's response will help dissipate your fears. Then when you ask, "Did you get one of these?" he will be more likely to respond positively because of your friendly greeting. And if someone asks what it is, just say, "It's a gospel tract" or "It has a gospel message on it. Please take the time to read it. Nice to meet you." If you handout the \$1 Million Bill, you may want to say, "It has a million-dollar question on the back. Be sure to read it!"

Words of Encouragement

Over the past few months our student ministry has been putting into practice the scriptural principles from the "Way of the Master" course. We started doing personal evangelism with family, friends and coworkers, then we slowly began witnessing to strangers in public places.

Our church is directly across the street from a junior high and half a block away from a high school. To share the gospel with larger groups of teenagers, we set up signs on our church lawn after school that invite people to take your IQ Test and win a prize. Then we do several public presentations of law and grace. During December we have signs that say "Have you been naughty or nice? Tell us what you think and win a prize!"

We've been able to share the gospel with up to 60 teens in half an hour. More and more students are hearing about sin, judgment, righteousness and the amazing grace of God through Jesus Christ. God has given us many opportunities to preach His message with clarity and boldness. We know that we are being faithful to the one and only gospel of Jesus Christ so any conversions will prayerfully be genuine. A lot of students have given some serious thought to their destiny without Christ.


The at-home-assignments will prepare you for taking the next step-applying what you're learning in the real world.
